

THE STATUS OF ACADEMIC VISITORS

- 1 The status of Academic Visitor is given to visiting University teachers on the recommendation of the Convenors of the appropriate departments. The status is intended to apply to scholars who have already published work of distinction. Convenors who wish to put forward names of persons for conferring the status of academic visitors are asked to write to the Deputy-Director, indicating in their letter:
 - (a) whether they or any other members of the department know the proposed visitor, either personally or through published work;
 - (b) whether they consider the visitor's presence will result in the substantial contribution to the academic life of the School;
 - (c) whether they are willing to accept general responsibility for the visitor;
 - (d) whether the Department is willing to provide space for the visitor.

While it is expected that Departments will normally give assurances as indicated under a, b and c above before the status of Academic Visitor is granted, it is recognised that not all Departments are in a position to provide space for their visitors, nor do visitors always require the use of an office.

- 2 It is now a requirement that before issue of an invitation, a Curriculum Vitae should be submitted.
- 3 Persons who are granted the status of Academic Visitor are entitled to use the Library.
- 4 Academic Visitors are, by arrangement with the Senior Common Room Committee, admitted to temporary membership of the Senior Common Room. The right to admit rests entirely with the Committee.
- 5 Academic Visitors from many countries outside the EU who receive financial support of any form, from a formal source of funding such as the government, university, research council, charitable organisation etc., to carry out research, will be required to have a Sponsored Research Work Permit to work at the School.
