Travel Grants

The Hellenic Observatory will be pleased to offer to successful applicants a PhD symposium bursary contributing towards related travel and accommodation expenditure.

Successful applicants who will be selected to participate in the Symposium will receive a Travel Grant, the level of which depends on the geographical location of their university. The amounts are as follows:

£100 if your university is based anywhere within the UK (except London*)

£400 if your university is based in any European country (except Greece, Cyprus and Turkey)

£500 if your university is based in Greece, Cyprus or Turkey

£700 if your university is based in any other county (including USA, Canada and Australia)

*Unfortunately, participants from London and the wider London area are not eligible for a Travel Grant.

The amounts will be paid in full and do not depend on submission of receipts for travel and accommodation expenditure.

If you are enrolled for an online degree, the amount of the travel grant will depend on the country in which you live and pursue your study. Proof of habitual residence will be required. Please contact us for more information.

Travel Grants

Eligible participants can apply for a Travel Grant once their Abstract has been accepted. Further information together with an invitation to complete the Travel Grant Claim Form will be sent to successful applicants upon completion of the selection process.

The Travel Grant Claim Form should be completed in full and returned by email to Hellenicobservatory.phd@lse.ac.uk.

Please note that incomplete and inaccurate information may result in a delay of your Travel Grant payment, so it is important that the information is provided clearly and correctly.

Payment of the Travel Grants can be made only via a bank transfer. The grant will be credited directly to the participant's bank account, after the Symposium has taken place and no later than 6 weeks after this date.
