

## Inequalities in multimorbid life expectancy in South Africa: a multistate modelling approach




## How does life expectancy for people with multimorbidity differ by sex and race?



Generally, people with more healthy life expectancy spend less time with multimorbidity.

Women spend more time with multimorbidity than men across all races.



Women who start with no or 1 disease at age 20 live 2-3 years longer than men.

Women with multimorbidity at age 20 live 7 years longer than men with multimorbidity.
