

**Early Career Plenary from the 2020 winner of the BPS early career award**

**Partnership dissolution, residential mobility, and housing in Britain and Europe**

Partner relationships, residential relocations and housing are crucial to people's well-being and are connected to each other. However, many aspects of this connection have remained under-researched. In this presentation, I will showcase findings from the PartnerLife project to fill some of these knowledge gaps. For example, we found that separation leads to elevated mobility levels and that the risk of a move remains high even several years after separation in England and Wales as well as across industrialised countries (Australia, Belgium, Germany, and the Netherlands). Additionally, I discuss where separated men and women move to (in terms of housing type and housing tenure) following union dissolution in the study countries and analyse their housing tenure trajectories following separation using sequence analysis and data for Britain. I conclude with a short summary and suggestions for future research.
