Anica Kostic has been recommended for a PhD award





MSc Data Science Capstone Projects are showcased in the EGI exhibition



There is still time to visit the Educating for Global Impact (EGI) exhibition on the ground floor of the Marshall Building – until the end of the term. Our MSc Data Science capstone projects have been showcased there! Dr Marcos Barreto goes into detail below about the capstone projects and their aims.

The capstone is a collaborative project, providing students with the opportunity to study and research in depth a data science problem proposed by an industry or academic partner. The problem will normally relate to data-based issues faced in practice by private or public sector organisations, requiring the use of specific data sources and data science skills learnt on the programme. The project is jointly supervised by an LSE faculty and company partner collaborators. It requires creative work in formulating research questions and hypotheses, identifying the most suited methodology, referring to research literature, analysing data sources using a variety of data science tools, and providing insights about the observed results and future directions. The students are able to develop and improve the hard and soft skills needed in most data science jobs.

The list of partners so far includes Microsoft, Tesco, Adobe, Facebook/Meta, Samsung, Alpha Telefónica, AstraZeneca, Capgemini, Koa Health, Siemens Advanta Consulting, Deutsche Bank, Agricom/Huggin Munin, Pareto Economics, ADIA, Google Research, Houghton Street Ventures, Plymouth Marine Laboratory, LSE Planning Division, Department of Methodology (LSE), Department of Government (LSE),

Thames Valley Violence Reduction Unit, and The Open University.

The topics covered by the projects span different areas, such as healthcare, finance, social sciences, logistics, agriculture, and environmental science. Some recent examples comprised i) forecasting of sea water transparency and monitoring of water pollution, ii) machine learning models applied to mental health interventions and monitoring of depression symptoms, iii) network/sentiment analysis applied to social media and company network data, iv) prediction models applied to supply chain and reorder point optimization, and v) use of alternative data in financial market forecasting.

Professor Fiona Steele has been recognised in the Queen's Birthday Honours List 2022!



Fiona Steele has been made a Commander of the Order of the British Empire (CBE) for her services to statistics in the social sciences.

Fiona's research in statistics is motivated by social science problems especially the methodological challenges in analysing longitudinal data and other types of social data with complex structure. She has worked on a range of applications in demography, education, family psychology and health.

She first joined LSE in 1996 as Lecturer in Statistics and Research Methodology. She then worked at the Institute of Education, University of London 2001-2005, followed by the University of Bristol 2005-2013 where she was Professor of Social Statistics and Director of the Centre for Multilevel Modelling. She returned to LSE in 2013.

Professor Steele was awarded the Royal Statistical Society Guy Medal in Bronze in 2008 and elected a Fellow of the British Academy in 2009. She was appointed an Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) in 2011 for services to social sciences.

Commenting on her award, Professor Steele said:

"I am delighted to receive this honour and for the recognition it brings to the essential role played by statisticians in social research. I have been fortunate to collaborate with and learn from many outstanding fellow social statisticians and social scientists throughout my career, and to benefit from the rich and supportive research environment in the Department of Statistics."

Marcos Barreto awarded Eden Centre Inclusive Education Action Plan Fellowship!



We are very excited to announce that Dr. Marcos Barreto has been awarded an Eden Centre Inclusive Education Action Plan (IEAP) Fellowship! The aim of these fellowships is to support staff to undertake work on decolonising higher education within their disciplinary field. The project led by Marcos will focus on data science teaching and assessment. Huge congratulations, Marcos! Details below.

Title: Decolonising Data Science teaching and assessment

This project focuses on two aspects related to data science education in light of decolonising: teaching and assessment. Is the way data science is taught adequate and inclusive, or is everyone forced to fit the same model? Do evaluative activities in data science teaching effectively measure students' critical and innovative ability or purely their technical capacity to memorize and repeat the same solutions? Also, whether the assessment is guided by the instructor's personal belief and experience in drawing "correct solutions" rather than students' understanding of the problem and subsequent solution. These are some initial questions leading this study.

Key outcomes comprise i) identifying the origins of data science teaching – who has established this basic structure and based on which coloniality context; ii) checking whether teaching staff and students are aware of and concerned with these problems, and thus keen to (re)evaluate their beliefs and practices towards decolonising and inclusivity; and iii) serving as an initial discussion of practical actions towards decolonising data science teaching and assessment at the department level.

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February 2022Pauline Barrieu is the next Vice Chair of the Academic Board (VCAB)!



Meena Kotecha has achieved her PhD from the University of Cambridge!



Her PhD thesis is entitled "Mathematics anxiety in university students: investigating the efficacy of a blended learning intervention promoting interaction, inclusion, & collaboration". Her doctoral research aimed to investigate the impact of an intervention she designed to tackle mathematics anxiety (MA) and understand, from students' perspectives, the main reasons for the effectiveness of this intervention. The intervention was implemented in statistics courses for non-specialist undergraduate students in a higher education (HE) institution in the United Kingdom (UK), during the academic year commencing in 2018. In total, 176 students from three courses participated in the study. A multi-mixed methods research was conducted to assess the intervention's impact on reducing reported MA and to understand the main reasons for its effectiveness. Results indicated a statistically significant reduction in the reported MA for students. Although the study was restricted to one HE institution, which limits the generalisability of results, the

inclusion of participants according to gender and nationalities allowed for some diversity in perspectives.
