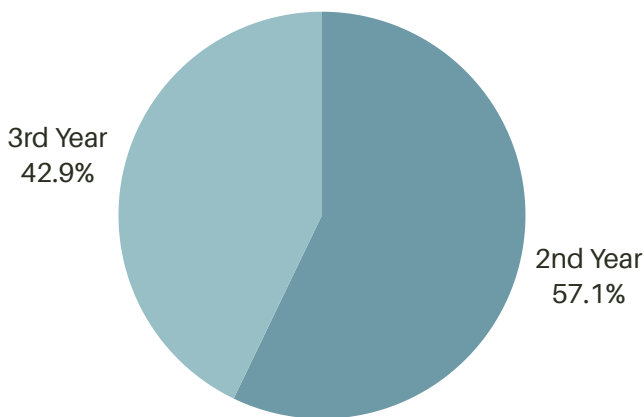

The PhD Summer Research Grants at a Glance

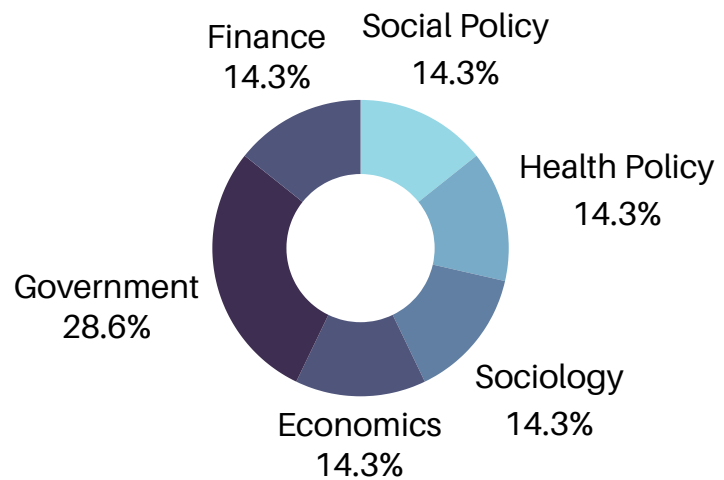
